Synopsis

A modern-day Corroboree called **"BURNOUT"** is held once every four years at the Mutonia Sculpture Park. The audience will be granted an 'access all areas' pass that will take them from the red central desert of Australia along the famed Oodnadatta Track, into Arabunna Country. Robin 'Mutiod' Cooke and the local Aboriginal Elders Uncle Kevin, Uncle Ronnie and Uncle Reggie host the gathering and **"ALL ARE WELCOME"**. This is a free event with freedom as it's theme.

The Corroboree attracts folks from diverse worlds including; artisans, travellers, philanthropists, activists, both locally and internationally. Namely, explorer Dick Smith, anthropologist Graham St John and sculptor artist Christian Patton. Some come for a month, others

for a few days to experience the unique wonder of an 'ancient future' transformative experience.

Visionary artist Robin 'Mutiod' Cooke who co-founded Mutoid Waste Co. in the 80's. He then **"ESCAPED"** his motherland, England, to settle in the outlying colony of Australia in order to pursue his artistic journey. The film will portray an Odyssey story of a man's quest to find his place – **"HIS PLAYGROUND"** – as Robin describes it – where he can be free to live out his artistic vision.

Arabunna Ancient Future will explore the plight of the longest living culture on planet earth and the new white-settlers way of life. The Aboriginal Elders have opened up their country in an unprecedented relationship with the 'white-fellas'. The audience is invited to an arm chair ride to learn

about the ancient future teachings of living in balance with nature, maintaining and caring for the fragile eco-system we all live in.

The documentary will also reveal the theme of a basic human desire for freedom of expression through community. This theme is explored through an intimate and vibrant lens which sees traditional Aboriginal corroboree methods, mixed with modern day festival culture and the rituals of synchronised time come together in a kaleidoscope of colour and character. The connection between the very ancient dreamtime sacred fire practices and the modern festival sub-culture becomes a forum as **"PEOPLE ARE WAKING UP"** to their own human consciousness and the unending horizon, not only of the desert landscape, but of human creativity itself.

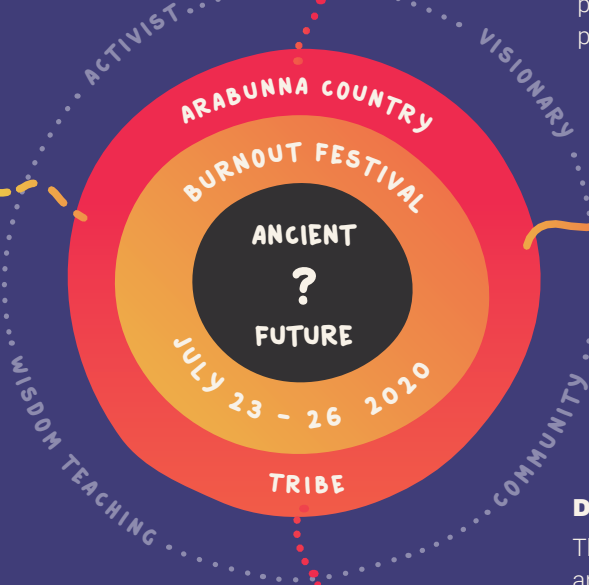

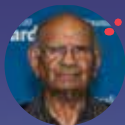
Uncle Ronnie Dodd
